Next to the gift of the breath of life and the gift of rebirth in Love Divine, the greatest gift given me by our Creator is my 40-year friendship with Barbara Davies. In her, I see living proof that Love transforms all. For the last decade, though her material mind has deteriorated, her soul mind continues to guide her unfalteringly. The Love she carries affects everyone who meets her.

On May 13th, Barb will turn 85. The following day, on May 14th, her son and daughter-in-law are hosting a birthday celebration to honor the Love that Barbara is and the many contributions she has made in her work and personal life. Barb is

Supporting these love-in-action projects will honour Barbara's long life of loving service to those in her community who faced multiple challenges including poverty, racism, addictions, mental illness and marginalization. Despite her physical limitations, Barb continues to serve as a channel of Love, and is a vital link in the chain of Love that connects all beings to our Creator.

JOINING THE DOTS (DENNIS TORMEY)

In this new section we are featuring the results of the fascinating research by Dennis Tormey, attorney and historian in the field of information relating to James Padgett.

One hundred fifty-two years ago, the USA was in the throngs of a great Civil War. The ravages of war were terrible. This was the case not only for the soldiers who died or were injured, but also for the citizens of every city and town where battles were fought.

In keeping with the Confederates' "scorched earth" policy, rebel forces were attacking townships, often getting into armed conflicts with the residents themselves. In July 1864, the Confederate army was heading into Maryland. They arrived in Hagerstown, and when they took the town, their leader, General John McCausland, set pencil to paper and wrote a ransom note. He demanded \$20,000 plus clothing for 1,500 men. If the ransom was not paid, his forces would torch the town and burn it to the ground.



As the Union army had many prisoners of war, the Confederate army was looking for © 2014 Virginia Civil War Trails, Inc. opportunities to obtain bargaining power by taking prominent Union citizens as

hostages. On July 29, 1864, McCausland's soldiers took hostage five Hagerstown men to be exchanged for some of the prisoners held in Jefferson County, West Virginia. The hostages, taken under guard to the Confederates' headquarters at Williamsport, were Frederick McComas, Isaac Nesbitt, Andrew H. Hager, Rev. Henry Edwards, and Rev. George W. Heyde. They were ultimately released, but we can only imagine the horror of not knowing what might happen during the uncertainty and fog of war. No doubt, these five gentlemen were relieved and happy to be back home in Hagerstown and reunited with their families.

Rev. George Heyde would have been joyfully welcomed by his young wife and their baby girl, not quite two years old, Helen Worman Heyde. Yes, the future Mrs. James E. Padgett may have never met her loving Ned had her father not returned from this horrific episode during the Civil War. MUSINGS ON PRAYER (REV. AL FIKE)

comes, if not immediately then in time.

Prayer is not asking. It is a longing of the soul. Or, to quote Mahatma Gandhi, "It is better in prayer to have a heart without words than words without a heart."

The simple but powerful quote from Gandhi says much about what we are aiming for in our prayer life. The challenge is how to get to that place of heartfelt, fervent prayer. So many factors stand in the way of experiencing that kind of communication with God that many give up the pursuit because they feel unsatisfied with the results.

Often our most soul-felt prayers occur in a crisis or out of a deep longing to know that God exists. It is in essence an act of faith, a knowing that someone or something out there listens. It's not quite a dialogue or conversation, but often there is a response. God does indeed hear our prayers and answer. This may not always be evident as we

may have a hard time discerning the response, but more often than not, an answer

As a gardener, I liken prayer to the hope and patience gardeners must have in order to grow a landscape. You place the potential in the ground in the form of a seed. Not much happens right away, but given time, patience and a little know-how, the garden begins to take shape. So it is with our souls. The seed of a desire emerges in our prayers. Often it is small and subtle, yet if nurtured, it has a great potential. In our impatient society, time is compressed and instant results are expected. In the garden of our souls, things like an instantaneous revelation and rapid growth are rare. Our souls take time to mature, and we need time to nurture their growth.

Divine Love is often referred to as the living waters. If we see our souls as a growing garden, this analogy fits perfectly. God placed many seeds or potentials into the soil of our souls. As we water our souls with prayer, God's response in the form of His Divine Love will cause the seeds to sprout and become something beautiful and unique. This miracle of growth and beauty is what delights the gardeners and keeps them toiling.

A garden is tangible and visible as it bears delightful fruit. By contrast, the nonphysical soul is far more subtle. The mind tends to dominate and often smothers the soul, making it difficult to discern amongst all those weedy thoughts. In contrast to the complexity of the mind, the soul is relatively simple in its needs. While no doubt a sophisticated part of us, its mechanisms, at least as a raw, undeveloped thing, are simple in their functioning. Hence the soul needs little to be sustained. Those living waters of God's Love are sufficient to trigger growth.

Prayer then is the key element for the soul gardener. Yet heartfelt and sincere prayer is often stunted by our mental machinations. Our minds get in the way of our prayers, yet both play a part in the process. As Gandhi says, better a wordless heartfelt prayer than one with no heart. Many find it easy to mouth a prayer, spin a wheel, or allow someone else to say a prayer on their behalf. This, however, does not turn on the tap. It may invoke some response depending on how invested we are in the process, but half-hearted attempts often bring half-hearted results.

One must pray from that place deep inside, with heart and soul. The closer we get to that place, the more fervent and focused we will be while in that state of consciousness, and the more the manna from heaven will rain upon us.

Prayer requires effort and discipline. It's not something to put in a box and take out when we have time. If prayer opens up a relationship with God, then for the best results to occur, that connection should remain at all times. A prayerful state is not just in verbal communication or silently communing with God. These times are important, but not the only way to pray. God is always reaching out to us and desiring connection. With a little discipline and openness, a soul can learn to sense this and remain connected. It is in this state of grace that we become attuned to and feel God's presence in our lives. The angels © Foundation Church of Divine Truth, Inc. often call this being in the flow of God's Love. That great river of Love is waiting for us to enter its flow and take us on a great journey. In order to get there however, we must tame our minds.

The mind does not readily work in concert with the soul. It wants dominance and reason, and is suspicious of faith-based actions. The mind's version of prayer is a word-oriented recitation. It may even not want to engage the soul in this endeavor. The mind does not like to share its seat of power in controlling our consciousness. So it is tricky to sidestep our minds and go to our souls. The weedy garden must first be dealt with.

In our pursuit of truth, we must first read the map. This can be the Padgett messages or another spiritual source. The road signs are important so that, with inspiration, we can discern how to take the leap of faith out of our mind into the soul. At first this can be daunting and a bit scary.

The soul holds the essence of who we are, and if we have been repressing many things over our lifetime, we may be in for a bit of a shock. The soul may be in either much pain or just numb because of the ignored or suppressed emotions which are seated there. The mind, in continuing the old pattern, often wants to take over and cover up the pain. One must persist, and often the soul compels us to do so. We feel the rightness in the act of prayer even though it feels different or even painful. On the soul level it is as natural as any physical act, but how we deal with the mind's resistance determines the success of our prayer. Listening to the urgings of the soul gives us the strength to push through, taking us beyond the barrier of self into the awareness of connection with the Divine. Once that is achieved, there is no turning back. When you truly feel God's Love for you, how can you ignore such a powerful life-affirming experience? You must keep returning to the well for more of those living waters to quench your thirst and water the garden of your soul.

Prayer then is a deep need or longing from the soul for something outside of itself. It needs connection with the Divine, a sense of coming home, being with Father, feeling the Love. Prayer can be full of requests without fear of asking too much as God's blessings are limitless. We limit what we receive by our own mind concepts and limited perceptions. This changes with time as our soul garden, watered by the living waters, grows. The seeds begin to sprout and take form, and the part of us often ignored or obscured by the mind comes into focus. New perceptions emerge with this blooming consciousness, and the possibility of living on the premise of faith and being guided by God becomes possible. Our consciousness shifts from mind-based reasoning to soul-based knowing.

Most of us are somewhere between these two levels of existence. We juggle between the mind and soul, engaging and disengaging as we see fit. We dance from one to the other, and when something difficult or painful happens in our lives, the mind is quick to discredit the validity of the soul or even the existence of a loving God. We are also tested and buffeted by a world skeptical of our experiences, and often buy into the prevailing views. But God hauls us back into the flow of His Love and reinforces the soul consciousness. The angels are ever willing to help us find our way if we let them.

We always have the choice. Help does not come unless we ask and are open to it. Many of us have had dry periods where we have felt out of the flow. Some have never felt a flow, just glimpses of it from the river bank. Yet I believe that we all sense it in one way or another. Our souls long to be in that water, carried by God, and we long to release ourselves to the current. Unfortunately our minds kick in all too often and shout the "what ifs". Letting go is a brave and seemingly dangerous act if the mind is to be believed. Just being in communion with God is often broken by the pestering of the mind. We tend to let our minds rule us like a spoiled child who constantly seeks our attention. Often we fear the consequences of being close to God despite our soul longings to be there. That battle rages every day in my life. I sit in prayer for an hour a day and then often get distracted by material things so that the precious Divine connection is ignored or broken off. As much as my soul longs for this, my mind still insists on dominance. It is the most frustrating thing and I wonder if that will be my lot until I pass into spirit. Only time will tell. More prayer please.
